REPORT ON PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

THE HONOURABLE THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

I HAVE the honour to submit the following report upon elections conducted during the period 1965-1969.

THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

APPENDIX 'A' of this report shows enrolment figures for all Legislative Council Divisions as at 30 June 1969, from which time rolls will be compiled on an adult suffrage basis.

The total enrolment shown in the preceding report was 152,973, on the 31 August 1964. Since that later date the total has increased by 8,454 to 161,427, which is equivalent to 76.18% of electors enrolled for the House of Assembly elections (211 805).
During the period under review, 71894 additions were made to the rolls; there were 63,440 deletions and 19,245 alterations - a total of 154,579 notations to obtain a nett increase of 8,454.

which took place in 1968. The proposals of the Select committee of the Legislative Council were put into operation by the Constitution (No. 2) Act of 1967. The redefined boundaries became operative on the day after the day fixed for holding the first periodical election of members after the passing of the Act. That former day being 26 May 1968. Between June and September 1968, 46,836 names were transferred on the various rolls and each elector was advised of that change of enrolment.

During the period under review two other Legislative measures brought about changes in the administration of Legislative Council elections. Firstly, by a Constitution Amendment. (No. 54 of 1967), the polling day was changed from the second to the fourth Saturday in May. This alteration was made to avoid the occurrence of the May School holidays on polling day. Secondly, hours of polling were changed from 8.30 a.m. - 7.00 p.m. to 8.00 am - 8.00 p.m. by the Electoral Act No. 65 of 1967. This latter change was brought about to provide a uniformity of polling hours to that of Commonwealth elections.

From 1 July 1969, electors for the Legislative Council are entitled to vote if they possess the following qualifications:—

- (a) Male or female persons over 21 years of age.
- (b) They have lived in the State continuously for a period of six months at any one time.
- (c) Natural born or naturalized subjects of the King.
- (d) Their name is on the electoral roll for any Council Division.

The above changes in the franchise was authorised by the Constitution Act No. 68 of 1968 which became law on 20 December 1968 to come into operation on 1 July 1969.

Approximately 50,000 persons will become eligible to enrol as a result of this further easing of the franchise for Legislative Council purposes.

WREST POINT CASINO LICENCE AND DEVELOPMENT REFERENDUM

The following dates were fixed for the holding of a referendum of House of Assembly electors:—

ISSUE OF WRITS—22 November 1968.

POLL—14 December 1968.

RETURN OF WRITS —On or before 19 December 1968.

The Act authorising the conduct of a referendum and specifying the legal form of documents became law on 22 November 1968. To have arranged the necessary facilities so that a poll of electors could be held at such short notice reflects greatly to the credit of Returning Officers, their staffs and to central administration. The possession of this capacity and a willingness to accept responsibility has always been a feature of Electoral staff too easily over-looked by many who are not conversant with either their function or proper location within the classification structure of the Public Service.

THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

The Assembly was dissolved by a proclamation issued under the hand of His Excellency the Governor on 11 April 1969.

The following dates were fixed for the purposes of the General Election—

ISSUE OF WRITS—14 April 1969.

NOMINATIONS—23 April 1969.

POLL—10 May 1969.

RETURN OF WRITS—On or before 30 May 1969.

The Writs were returned on 22 May 1969, from which date the life of Parliament commenced.

Nominations for this election totalled 105 (Bass 23, Braddon 21, Dension 21, Franklin 19, Wilmot 21).

The draw for party group position on the ballot paper resulted in the Labour Group being placed first in two Divisions, an Independent Group first in one Division, the D.L.P. Group first in another Division and the Liberal Group first in the remaining Division.

The Centre Party contested the 1969 General Election for the first time, nominating 14 Candidates and returning one Member.

The electors were provided with 460 polling booths at which 198,571 ordinary votes, 13,706 absent votes and 369 votes under Section 116a were recorded.

Hours of Polling for the House of Assembly were similarly altered by Act No. 65 of 1967 as they were for Legislative Council Elections.

During 1968, major Re-division proposals were adopted. The practical effect of the alterations in terms of enrolment is shown in Appendix 'E'.

A number of Sub-divisional boundaries were also re-defined in July 1969. The purpose of these changes being to reduce over-large Sub-divisions to a more realistic size by creating new Sub-divisions; amalgamating very small Sub-divisions with others and re-locating Sub-divisional boundaries to allow better use to be made of polling facilities.

Permanent officers of the Department have performed their duties in a completely unselfish and efficient manner. Service to the public by them has always been of first importance. The Government Printer has on many occasions given the Department great assistance at short notice. Although there has not been the need to make use of officers of the Police Department to any great extent, their willingness to assist does not pass without notice and appreciation.

APPENDIX 'F'

REFERENDUM 14 DECEMBER 1968

Wrest Point Casino Licence and Development (Referendum) Act 1968

A submission was made to House of Assembly electors of the following question, 'Are you in favour of the granting of a casino licence to *Wrest Point Hotel* conditional on the proposed development of that hotel?' To this question electors were required to show a numerical preference in squares placed opposite the words 'Yes' and 'No' printed on the Ballot-papers.

Writs for the Referendum were issued on the 22 November 1968 and were returnable on or before the 19 December 1968.

Provisions of the *Wrest Point Casino Licence and Development Bill 1968* were publicly advertised, in full content, in the State's three leading newspapers. The following advertising also was placed in those newspapers on the 7 and 11 December 1968:—

- (1) An argument in favour of the question submitted, consisting of not more than one thousand words and authorised by a majority of the members of both Houses of Parliament who supported an affirmative vote on that question and desired to authorise such an argument; and
- (2) An argument against that question consisting of not more than one thousand words and authorised by a majority of members of Parliament who supported a negative vote on that question and desired to authorise such an argument.

The census of 1966 showed the proportion of adults to be 568 per 1000 of the total population of Tasmania. The franchise was extended to certain classes of persons (minors) who had experienced war service, which was mainly responsible for the increase in the number of voters per 1000 of population to 611 in 1948. By 1950, however, the effect of this concession was no longer apparent due to the effluxion of time and movement in population.

The proportion of informal votes (4.66 per cent) represents an increase of 0.34 per cent on 1964. The divisions showed percentages ranging from 4.21 in Braddon to 4.96 in Denison.

The number of candidates totalled 105, which was the second highest number on record. The highest being in 1964, when 117 candidates nominated.

The total number of counts was 956 and the greatest number of counts in a division occurred in Bass where 236 were recorded.

The preceding table, giving the percentage of electors who exercised the franchise at all general elections, both State and Federal, since 1916, indicates roughly the rise and fall of political interest among the electors up to 1928. Both its rise and fall are much more pronounced in the case of women than of men. The proportions for the subsequent elections are dominated by compulsory voting, first in the Federal sphere and later in the State. The absence of many electors from the State on military service would largely account for the lower percentage of voters at the elections in 1940 and 1941.

REPRESENTATION OF PARTIES

At the election of the 10 May 1969, 105 candidates were nominated. Of these, 40 were endorsed nominees of the Labor Party, 36 were nominated by the Liberal Party, 14 were nominated by the Centre Party, 10 were nominated by the Democratic Labor Party and 5 nominated as Independents.

The result was the return of 17 Labor and 17 Liberal and 1 Centre Party.

The No. 1 votes were cast directly for the six groups in each of the five electoral divisions of the State as follows—

The method of election is briefly the 'single transferable vote' system, and the law provides that a seat be allotted to each complete quota of votes in each division.

The quota in each division is ascertained by the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Number of valid ballot-papers}}{\text{Number to be elected} + 1} + 1 = \text{Quota.}$$

Any remainder is ignored.

The following table shows for each division, and for the State as a whole, the number of first preference votes, the number of quotas, and the seats won by each party:—

From the above table it will be seen that there were 2.06 quotas of Labor votes made up of unrepresented fractions for 17 members elected, Liberal votes were under-represented by 0.61 quotas for 17 members elected, Centre Party voters elected 1 member with 0.72 of a quota not represented, while other candidates were under represented by 1.61 quotas with no member elected.

The following Table 7 shows the party strength as indicated by the quotas of No. 1 preferences, and the seats actually won by Labor, Liberal and other groups at each general election since 1959, and the total for the State is the aggregate of the results for the five divisions.

The preferential system of voting therefore resulted in slight over-representation of Liberal at the expense of Labor, Centre Party and other candidates according to State-Wide First Choice Support.

A brief summary of the results of the 1969 election for each division is appended:—

BASS

There were 23 candidates in this Division, of whom eight were Labor, seven Liberal, three Centre Party, three Democratic Labor and two Independent. Valid votes numbered 36,642 of which 16,919 were recorded for Liberal, 15,553 Labor, 1,634 for the Centre Party, 723 for Democratic Labor and 1,813 for Independents. Liberal candidates secured 3.69 quotas and gained four seats; Labor 3.39 quotas for three seats and the remaining candidates obtained 4,170 representing 0.92 of a quota.

A Labor candidate was elected at count 10, two Liberal candidates at count 31 and another Labor candidate at count 43. A Liberal candidate was elected at count 158 and another Liberal at count 205. The seventh vacancy was filled by a Labor candidate at count 236. Nine deposits were forfeited in this Division two Labor, one Liberal two Centre Party, two Democratic Labor and two Independents.

BRADDON

Twenty one candidates—eight Labor, seven Liberal, four Centre Party and two Democratic Labor nominated for Braddon. Labor polled 21,153 votes, 4.30 quotas for four seats; Liberal 13,544 votes, 2.75 quotas for two seats; the Centre Party 4,115 votes, 0.84 quotas for 1 seat and the Democratic Labor Party 549 votes; the total vote being 39,361.

First preference votes secured the election of one Labor candidate. A Liberal candidate was elected at count 55. One Labor candidate was elected at each of the counts 77, 87 and 126. A Centre Party candidate and a Liberal Party candidate were elected at count 169. In this Division eight candidates forfeited their deposits. These were:—two Labor, one Liberal, three Centre Party and two Democratic Labor.

DENSION

This Division was contested by twenty-one candidates—eight Labor, eight Liberal, two Centre Party, two Democratic Labor and one Independent. Of the 39,362 valid votes, Labor polled 17,198 votes, 3.49 quotas for three seats; Liberal 18,676 votes, 3.80 quotas for four seats; the Independent 2,395, Democratic Labor 845 and the Centre Party candidates 248 votes.

One Liberal and one Labor candidate were elected on first preferences, and the remaining candidates in the following orders:—Liberal candidates at count 103, 144 and 157; two Labor candidates at count 192. Six candidates:—two Labor, two Centre Party and two Democratic Labor forfeited their deposits.

FRANKLIN

Nineteen candidates contested the election for Franklin. Eight of these were Labor, seven Liberal, two Centre Party and two Democratic Labor. The total valid vote was 35,619 and of this number Labor candidates polled 18,542 votes, 4.16 quotas for four seats; Liberals 15,738 votes, 3.52 quotas for three seats; the Centre Party 651 votes and Democratic Labor 688 votes. Two Labor candidates and one Liberal were elected on first preferences; two more Labor candidates at count 170; a Liberal candidate at count 193 and another Liberal at count 194.

Deposits were forfeited by five candidates, one Liberal, two Centre Party and two Democratic Labor.

WILMOT

Wilmot was contested by twenty-one candidates—eight Labor, seven Liberal, three Centre Party, two Democratic Labor and one Independent. Labor polled 17,832 of the total of 38,339 valid votes for 3.72 quotas and three seats; Liberals totalled 18,384 votes, 3.84 quotas for four seats; the Centre Party 1,512; Democratic Labor 453 and the one Independent polled 158 votes.

One Liberal and one Labor were elected on primary votes; two more Liberals at count 68: Labor candidates at the 117 and 140 counts and a Liberal candidate at count 164.

There were seven deposits forfeited by candidates, two Labor, one Liberal, two Centre Party and two Democratic Labor.

ABSENT VOTES, POSTAL VOTES, AND SECTION 116A

Under the provisions of Section 116A, 369 persons whose names were not on the roll claimed the right to vote, and filled in ballot-papers. Of these 256 were rejected because their claim to be on the roll could not be sustained. The remaining 113 were admitted to the scrutiny and four of them rejected for informalities, leaving 109 valid votes under Section 116A.

The number of absent votes was 13,706, but these included some whose names were not, in fact, on the roll, and 1,249 were rejected on this account. A further 661 were rejected for informalities, leaving 11,796 valid absent votes.

Taking together the claims under Section 116A and attempts to vote under provisions for electors absent from their usual subdivisions, the number of votes disallowed were:—1969, 1,505; 1964, 2,537; 1959, 2,515; 1956, 1,941; 1955, 1,703; 1950, 1,749; 1948, 1,650; 1946, 1,448; 1941, 2,283; 1937, 1,897; 1934, 1,687; 1931, 2,086. These disallowed votes are not counted either as votes recorded or as informal votes.
