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Introduction

This report provides a summary and analysis of the 1999 Tasmanian local government election conducted in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1993*.

Background

Tasmania's biennial local government elections were held in March 1999.

The elections were originally scheduled for 1998, and commenced in July of that year, but were not completed as a result of a decision of the Supreme Court. The elections were then conducted in March 1999.

Elections were held in 28 of the 29 councils, the exception being Derwent Valley, which went to election in November 1998. Half the councillor positions were elected, together with by-elections for 15 casual vacancies.

At the same time, elections were held for the positions of Mayor and Deputy Mayor in the Burnie, Clarence, Devonport and Glenorchy City Councils and the Southern Midlands Council, and for Lord Mayor and Deputy Lord Mayor in the Hobart City Council. The mayors and deputy mayors in the other councils were elected by the councillors at meetings following the councillor elections.

A total of 335 candidates nominated for a total of 152 councillor positions, 17 candidates nominated for 6 mayoral positions and 25 candidates nominated for 6 deputy mayoral positions.

As the number of candidates equalled the number of vacancies for councillors on the Flinders and Central Highlands Councils, and for Mayors of the Glenorchy and Clarence City Councils, polls were not required for these elections.

The next biennial elections are scheduled for October 2000.

The Tasmanian Electoral Office (TEO) produced a candidates information booklet for the 1999 elections which provided practical information on such matters as nomination, advertising, voting and scrutineers, and incorporated recent changes to the *Local Government Act 1993*.

An information booklet for printers, publishers and broadcasters was also produced for the first time this year, providing practical information for the media and those who produce election campaign material.

Copies of both booklets are available from the TEO.

Conduct of elections

These were the third biennial elections held under the *Local Government Act 1993*, previous elections having been held in 1994 and 1996.

The Act provides that the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) is responsible for the supervision of elections, and is to undertake some specific tasks such as the production of ballot papers, forms and both statutory and public awareness advertising. It also requires that the CEO approve some forms and procedures and appoint returning officers.

This year, in addition, the TEO was requested to take full responsibility for the conduct of 24 of the 28 elections, with Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) divisional returning officers being appointed as returning officers under a contractual arrangement. In the other 4 councils, returning officers were appointed following recommendations from the councils.

Postal voting

The *Local Government Act 1993* introduced universal postal voting as an option for council elections. An Act of Parliament, the *Local Government (Special Elections) Act 1993*, was also passed at that time requiring all 18 council elections due in 1994 to be conducted by post. The special Act was amended in 1995 to again require all elections to be conducted by post in 1996.

Following the success of these postal voting trials, the *Local Government Act 1992* was amended in December 1998 to require all future elections to be conducted by postal ballot.

The 3-envelope system was again used to ensure the secrecy and security of the ballot. This system involves an outer window face envelope, a reply paid envelope and a ballot paper security envelope with an extended perforated flap for voter details and signature. This information is required to verify that only eligible electors vote.

In addition to the above envelopes, the postal ballot pack included the ballot paper(s), and an information brochure containing voting instructions and candidate statements.

Sample ballot material is reproduced in the attachments to this report.

Changes since 1996

In December 1998, the *Local Government Amendment Act 1998* was enacted. This amendment Act essentially put into place the same postal voting system that was used at the local government elections in 1994 and 1996.

There were some key changes to the election system

- The electoral roll now closes one day earlier, that is at 6 pm on a Thursday rather than a Friday. This allows for general manager's rolls to be incorporated on the Friday.
- The nomination period now closes at 12 noon on a Wednesday rather than a Thursday to allow additional time for printing of ballot papers and candidate statements. The public announcement of nominations accepted is not made until 12 noon on the Thursday, and is followed by the draw for positions on the ballot paper. This allows 24 hours for the verification and correction (if required) of nominations and candidate statements.
- The Act and Regulations have been amended to provide for the rotation of candidate names on ballot papers, in the same manner as for parliamentary elections in Tasmania.
- The scrutiny process has been amended to provide for the amalgamation of transfer values when excluding candidates. This results in a significant reduction in the time taken, and a small reduction in the cost involved, in completing the count.

Enrolment

People who were on the House of Assembly electoral roll were automatically enrolled on the local government roll.

Others who owned or occupied land in a municipal area but who were not eligible to be on the House of Assembly roll for that area were entitled to apply to enrol on the general manager's roll.

Corporate bodies who owned or occupied land in the municipal area were also entitled to nominate a representative to the general manager's roll.

A total of 333 450 electors were enrolled in the 28 councils at the close of rolls at 6pm on 11 February. These comprised 322 996 (96.86%) from the state House of Assembly roll and 10 454 (3.14%) from the general manager's rolls.

In the period 9–12 March 1999, 330,004 electors across the state received postal ballot packs for the 26 councils having contested elections.

Enrolment statistics for each council are shown in this report.

NOTE—The 1999 Launceston Cup bank holiday fell on Wednesday 24 February, the final day for receipt of nominations. In councils affected by this holiday, section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1931* operated to extend the time for receipt up to 12 noon on the following day—Thursday 25 February 1999. The public announcement of nominations in these councils and the draw for positions on the ballot paper was thus delayed until 12 noon on Friday 26 February 1999. Affected councils were—Break O'Day, Dorset, George Town, Glamorgan/Spring Bay, Launceston, Meander Valley, Northern Midlands, Southern Midlands and West Tamar.

Public awareness & statutory advertising

The Local Government Act 1993 provides that the CEO may promote public awareness and understanding of elections, and encourage enrolment and voting. A statewide advertising campaign was conducted by television, radio and newspapers to create awareness of the elections and encourage participation in the postal voting system.

Regular press releases gave progressive updates on the number of ballot papers returned for all councils. Electoral officers were available for interviews.

Under the Act, the CEO is also required to place prominent statutory advertisements in newspapers to advertise election dates, call nominations, list candidates, notify ballots where required, and to advertise the results of ballots conducted.

As at previous elections, the TEO provided a freecall telephone enquiry service. The availability of this service was promoted extensively in our advertising campaign, and appeared on information brochures sent to each elector with ballot papers.

Electoral system

Voting in Tasmanian local government elections is not compulsory.

All elections for councillor positions are to be conducted using a system directly modelled on the Hare-Clark method of proportional representation used in Tasmanian House of Assembly elections.

The scrutiny process has now been amended to provide for the amalgamation of transfer values when excluding candidates. This amendment resulted in a significant reduction in the time taken, and a small reduction in the cost involved, to complete the count. It will have only minor effect on the result of an election and is arguably no more or less fair than the previous system.

Under the Hare-Clark electoral system, ballot papers are distributed at either full or fractional transfer values. Due to the relatively small number of electors in some local government elections all ballot papers are multiplied by 100 to reduce the loss of votes by fraction. It is worth noting here that the introduction of amalgamated transfer values has made this issue less significant.

As in parliamentary elections, the Robson rotation system is now used to rotate the order in which candidate names appear on ballot papers for local government elections.

Mayors and deputy mayors are elected by either the electors or the councillors. Mayoral elections, by electors, were conducted by postal vote in conjunction with councillor elections and use a preferential electoral system similar to that used for Legislative Council and Federal House of Representatives elections.

Most scrutines were conducted utilising the 'HC Auto' computerised scrutiny system to improve the efficiency and accuracy of the count. This system was developed in Tasmania and used successfully at the 1996 Local Government elections, the last two Tasmanian House of Assembly elections and at ACT elections.

Tally-room & election results

A state tally-room was set up at the Wrest Point Boardwalk Gallery in Hobart and operated from 6 pm until about midnight on Tuesday 23 March. Progressive first preference results for all councils, including mayoral election results, were displayed on tally boards.

The media, candidates and the general public were all invited to attend this event. It provided an opportunity for candidates to give media interviews, and a venue for the local government community to discuss results as they became available.

Results were posted on the TEO website (see below). Results were also available from the TEO, returning officers or council offices from Wednesday 24 March.

The majority of the election scrutinies were completed on Wednesday 24 March, with the more complex scrutinies being completed by Friday 26 March. The actual time required for each scrutiny varied considerably and was largely dependent on the numbers of positions vacant and candidates.

For the first time at our local government elections, results and other information including enrolment statistics and candidate details were available on the TEO website.

First preference results were posted on the web as they became available on the evening of 23 March, and progressive scrutiny results as available from 24 March.

The site received 26,000 hits on the evening of 23 March and a further 24,000 and 21,000 on the following 2 days respectively.

It is anticipated that the website will be developed further for future local government elections.

Cost of elections

For those councils where the TEO fully conducted the election, the cost, with a few exceptions, ranged from approximately \$2.40 to \$3.00 per enrolled elector.

The actual cost depended on the size of the council, and the number of candidates and positions to be filled.

Although the introduction of the amalgamation of transfer values in the scrutiny process provided some savings, this was offset by the impact of Robson rotation on both printing and scrutiny costs.

The cost of typesetting, proofing and printing doubled, to accommodate the 536 different versions of ballot papers required under the Robson rotation system. This amounted to an average increase of nearly 10 cents per elector across the State. However the cost impact of Robson rotation was greater for councils where a mayoral and deputy mayoral election was also conducted.

The cost of scrutinies also increased, due partly to the introduction of Robson rotation.

The overall extra cost to councils having postal ballots for mayors and deputies was between 30 and 50 cents per elector.

Effectiveness of ballot material & advertising

The 1999 statewide response rate of 55.8% was slightly lower than that of 1996 (59.5%), although slightly higher than the 1994 statewide response rate of 55%

A number of factors may have influenced this rate, in particular including the lower number of positions and hence candidates contesting the elections, local issues at the time and the higher than usual number of people on the state electoral roll.

The TEO commissioned Associate Professor Richard Herr to independently assess public reaction and the impact of the advertising campaign and the effectiveness of the postal ballot material used. The research involved a statewide public opinion poll of 500 Tasmanians by telephone.

Generally, the survey results indicated a high level of support for postal voting, and a good level of recognition of the advertising campaign conducted by the TEO.

The general findings of the report are reproduced below. The full report is available from the TEO on request.

General findings—The introduction of postal voting has increased public participation in local government dramatically but recent levels have drifted somewhat below those first achieved in the first blush of novelty. Thus, questions could arise as to whether anything might be done to improve the level of participation, particularly in terms of the information needed to lodge a ballot properly and on time. A telephone survey of Tasmanian ratepayers was undertaken to explore these possibilities. The findings of this survey suggest that it might be possible to lift participation levels. However, these findings also indicate that technical fine-tuning of the mechanics/information of postal balloting is unlikely to significantly improve the current levels.

1. Perhaps one of the more significant general results is the high level of support for postal balloting. This can be seen in the responses of those who did not vote as well as those who did. The former recorded few complaints against the system while more than 95% of the latter found the system 'easy' to use. In addition many respondents volunteered support for the postal voting system
2. Political disinterest in local government is a significant factor in non-participation. Two primary reasons were offered for not voting—'a lapse of memory' and 'a lack of interest'. While forgetfulness was the larger response, it appears from other responses (particularly in Q3) that apathy toward this tier of government is a major contributor to the memory lapse. Convincing ratepayers to take local government more seriously seems likely to raise participation levels more than any other single measure.
3. In so far as the reported failure to remember to complete and post the ballot is genuine, this is an area where more effective advertising could help to lift participation rates. However, given the high levels of reported recognition of electoral office materials, the financial costs of crossing another threshold of awareness could be very high.
4. Broadly, while there was widespread awareness of electoral office materials, specific advantages were attached to specific media.
Newspapers were valued for their accessibility—'you could refer to it whenever you wanted to' summed up this view of the value of newspaper advertising and advice.
Television, on the other hand, enjoyed particular support from those who needed their memories jogged.
Radio seemed to have a very low recognition factor.
5. If there was one key informational problem amongst the relatively few reported, it was a difficulty in linking the candidates' names and policies to the ballot paper.
With a rotational system in place, this problem is likely to be more severe.

Casual vacancies

A casual vacancy is filled (where possible) by recount unless the vacancy occurs within 6 months of a forthcoming election. A candidate elected at a recount serves until the next council election.

If a recount is not possible, a by-election is held—with the candidate elected to serve for the remainder of the term of office of the original councillor.

If a vacancy occurs within 6 months of a forthcoming council election, the vacancy is filled by a by-election held in conjunction with the council election.

28 casual vacancies occurred between the 1996 and 1999 elections. 21 of these were filled by recount, 1 by single by-election and 6 by by-elections held in conjunction with the March 1999 elections.

Following the March 1999 elections, 8 casual vacancies were filled by recounts and 2 casual vacancies were filled at by-elections conducted in June 1999.

The casual vacancy section of the report commences on page 105.

Elector polls

A council may hold an elector poll on any issue it determines. It may also be required to hold an elector poll following a process requiring petitions signed by at least 5 % or 1000 of the electors in the municipal area, whichever is the lesser (as set out in Part 6 of the *Local Government Act 1993*).

A council is not bound by the result of an elector poll.

In January 1998, 10 elector polls were conducted in relation to the proposed amalgamation of councils. The results of these polls are on pages 125-128.

Structure of this report

The *Statewide Election Statistics* section provides statistics for all councils at the various stages of the postal voting system, including an informal ballot paper survey.

The *Councillors as at 18 October 1999* section lists the names of all mayors, deputy mayors and councillors, including those elected at the March elections.

The *Local Government Election Results* section provides a double page spread for each councillor and mayoral election. The first page consists of a graph displaying the number of first preference votes received by each candidate. The second page shows the distribution of preferences in tabulated form. It should be pointed out that the first preferences for each councillor candidate have been multiplied by 100, as mentioned previously under the *Electoral System* section.

The *Casual Vacancy* section includes a summary of all by-elections and recounts since 1996. Similar to the previous section, the results of each contested by-election and recount are presented by a graph and table.

The *Elector Poll* section includes results of the 10 elector polls conducted since the 1996 elections.

The *Candidate Details* section lists the names and localities of all candidates contesting the 1999 elections, the 1998 Derwent Valley election and by-elections held since 1996.

The *Attachments* include examples of ballot and advertising material used.

Statistical information in electronic form

The statistical information contained in this report can also be provided in electronic form via our website or on disc.

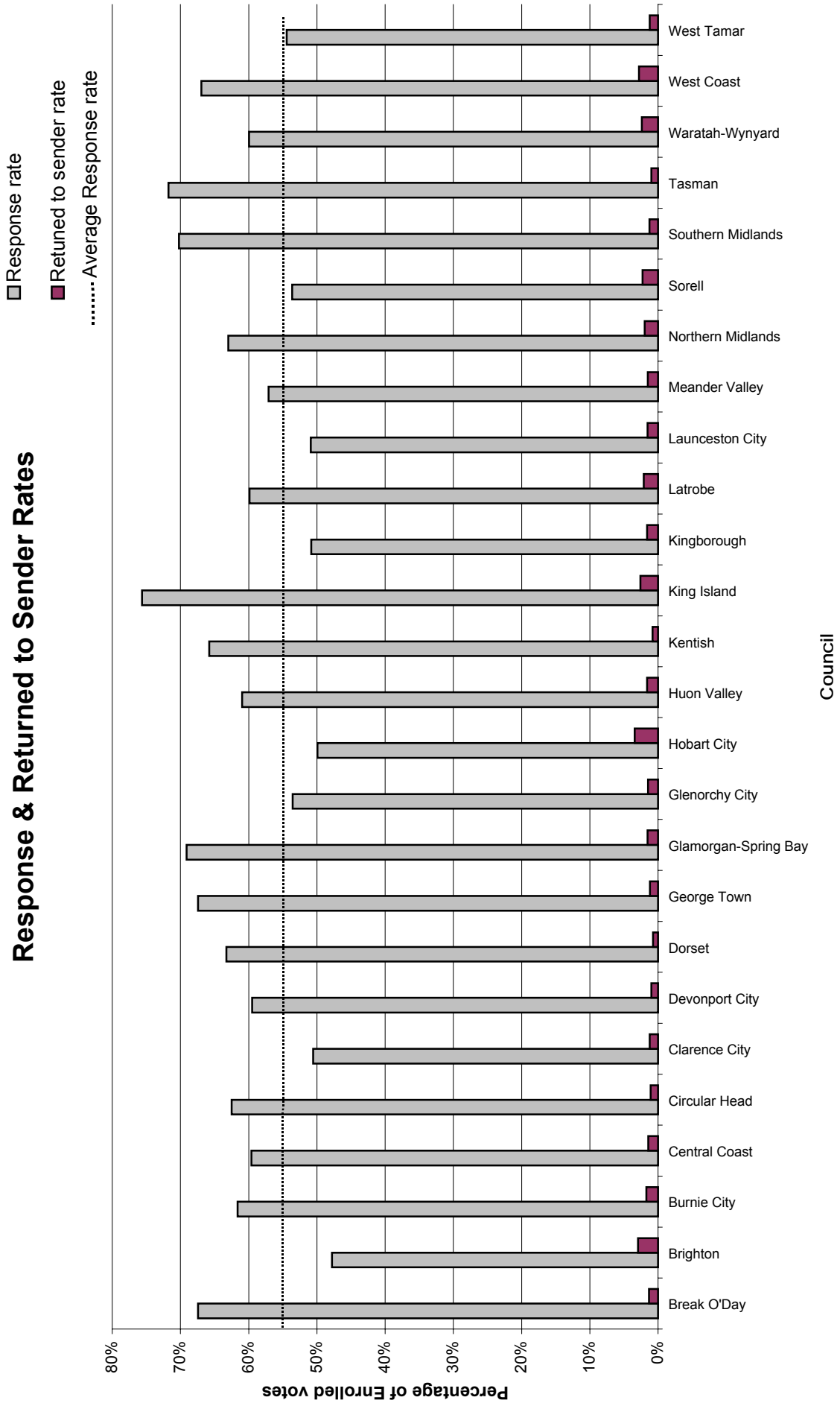

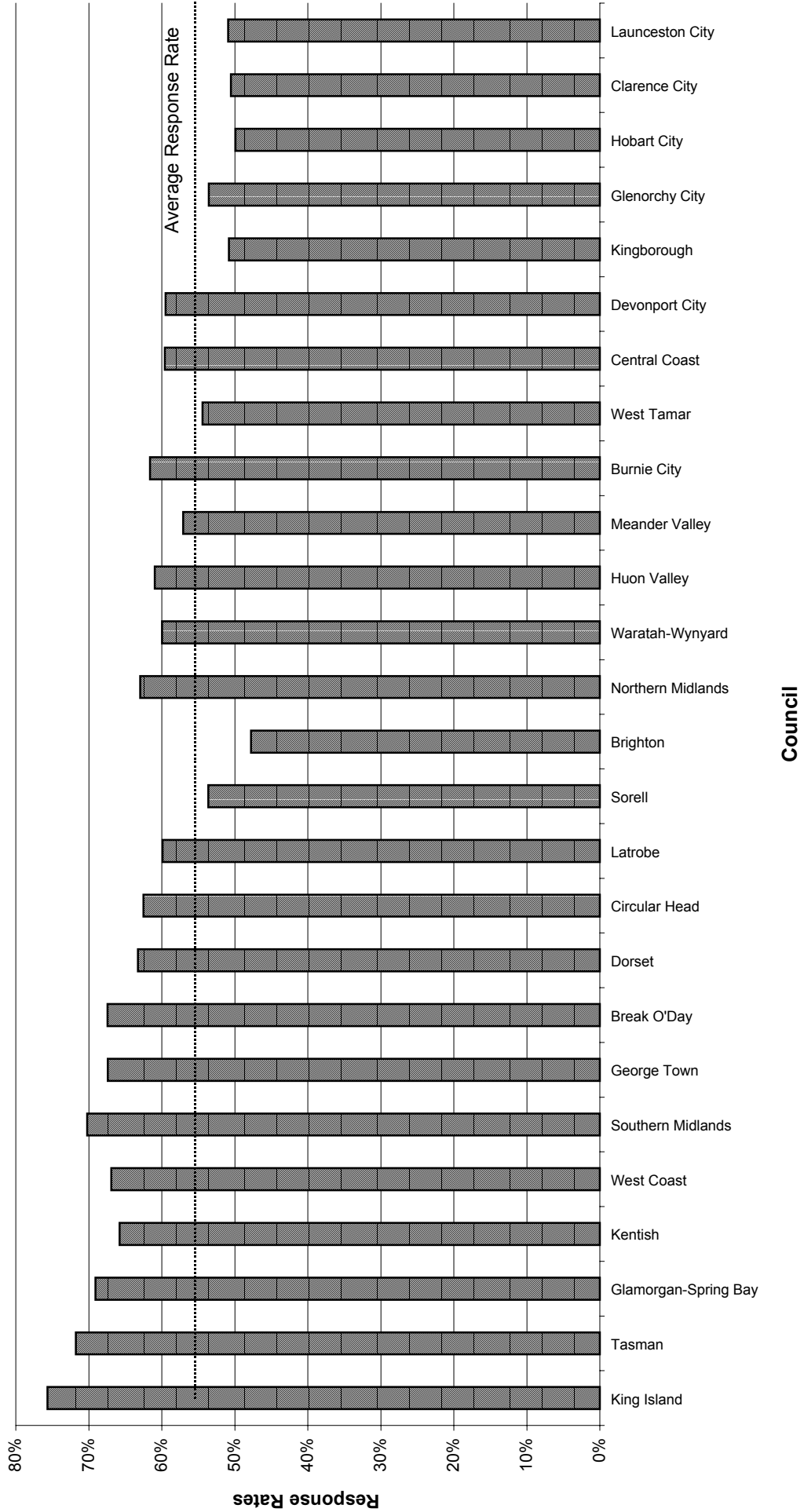
Response & Returned to Sender Rates

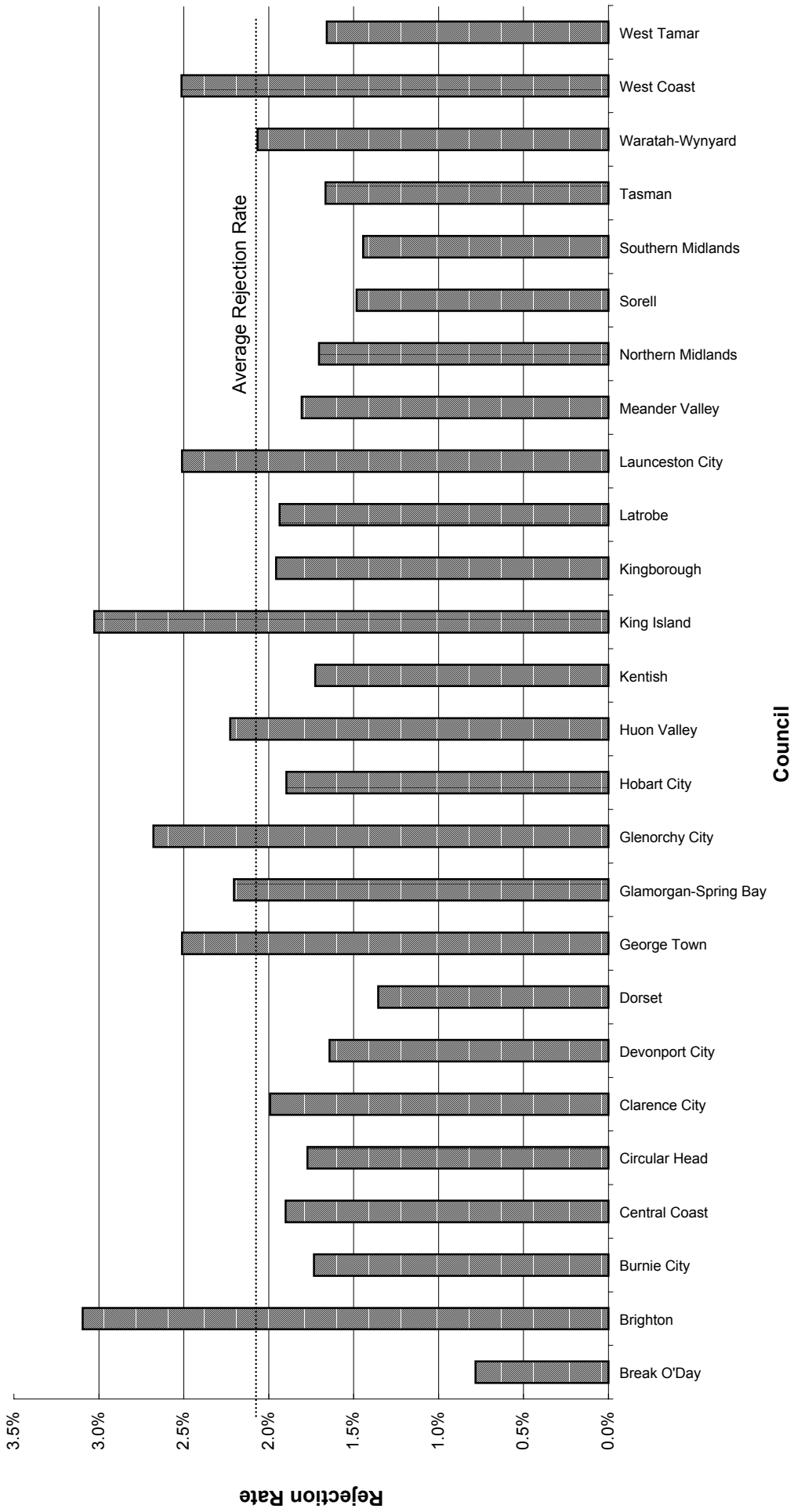
Council Response Rates in order of Enrolment

Declaration Rejection Rates



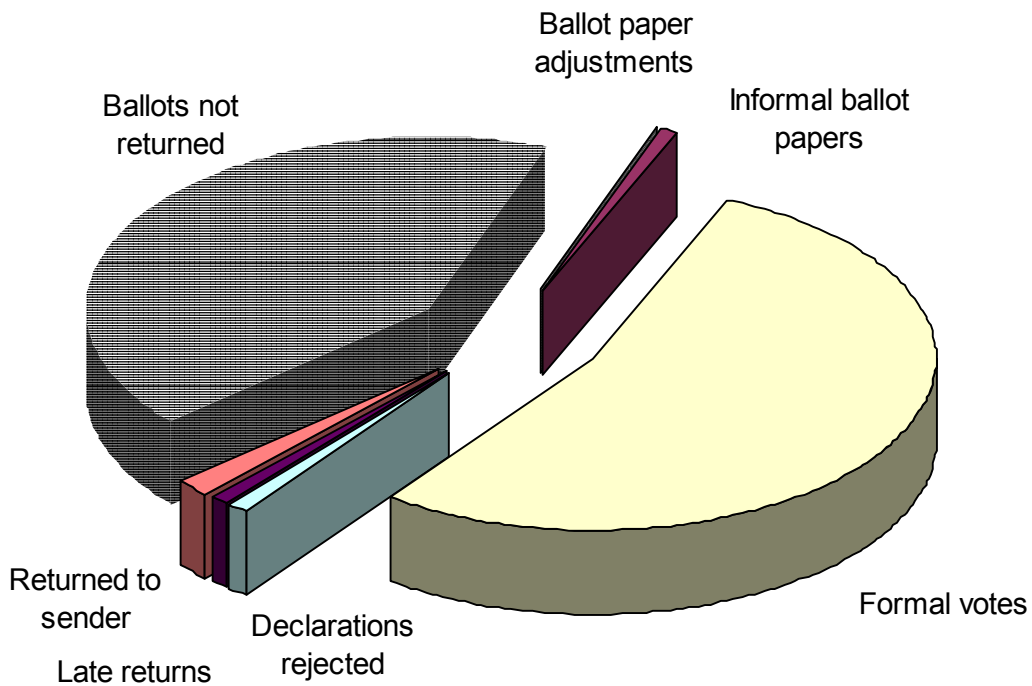

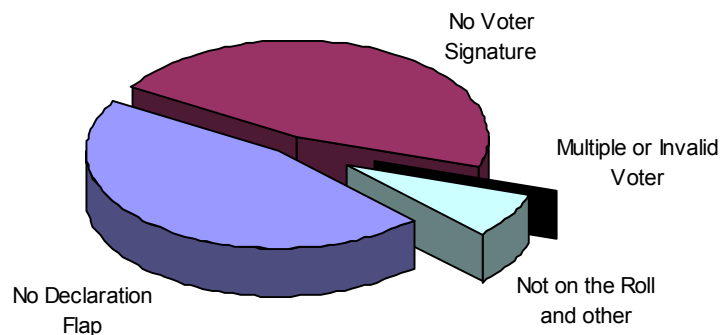

STAGES 3-4: Ballot papers admitted & formality
