## Local Government Elections in Tasmania

Every two years elections are held in all 29 councils for the positions of mayor and deputy mayor and half the councillor positions. Where required, by-elections are held concurrently for vacancies that have occurred since the last elections.

The Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) supervises the conduct of elections in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993. Elections by postal ballot have been held in 1994, 1996, 1999 (deferred from 1998), 2000, 2002, 2005 (deferred from 2004) with the next elections due in October 2007.

Since 2000 mayors and deputy mayors are elected directly by the electors in all municipal areas. Previously, in most councils, mayors and deputy mayors were elected by the councillors at the first meeting of a new council.

## Casual vacancies

Casual vacancies are filled by recount where possible, unless the vacancy occurs within 6 months of a forthcoming election. Only unelected candidates from the relevant election may contest a recount. A candidate elected at a recount serves until the next council election. If a recount is not possible, a by-election is held-with the candidate elected to serve for the remainder of the term of office of the original councillor.

## Elector polls

A council may hold an elector poll on any issue it determines. It may also be required to hold an elector poll following petitions from electors in accordance with Part 6 of the Act. A council is not bound by the result of an elector poll.

## Electoral system

Voting in Tasmanian local government elections is not compulsory.
Elections for councillor positions are conducted using a system modelled on the Hare-Clark method of proportional representation used in Tasmanian House of Assembly elections. Mayoral and deputy mayoral elections use a preferential system similar to that used for Tasmanian Legislative Council and Federal House of Representatives elections.

## Report on the 2005 Waratah-Wynyard Council Election

Elections were held for the positions of Mayor and Deputy Mayor for 2 year terms, and 5 Councillors for 4 year terms and an Elector Poll.

For the 2005 Local Government elections, 9912 Waratah-Wynyard electors were enrolled, comprising 9719 ( $98.05 \%$ ) from the State House of Assembly roll and 193 ( $1.95 \%$ ) from the General Manager's roll.

The percentage of Waratah-Wynyard electors returning their ballot papers was $68.12 \%$, in comparison with $58.52 \%$ statewide.

## Recounts

One recount was held between the 2002 and 2005 elections. Councillor Dorothy Calvert resigned from the Waratah-Wynyard Council on Friday 16 April 2004. Five unelected candidates from the 2002 Waratah-Wynyard Council election contested the recount. The recount took place at noon Tuesday 27 April 2004. Full details are provided on the back page.

## Result of Elector Poll

The original name assigned to the municipality on 6 January 1908 was the Municipality of Table Cape. On 24 October 1945 the Council name was changed to Wynyard Municipal Council. The council again changed names on 2 April 1993 to what it is named today - Waratah-Wynyard Council. This name change coincided with the amalgamation of the former Waratah and Wynyard municipalities. The intention of the Local Government Board at the time of the 1993 amalgamation was to allow the new Council to consider an appropriate name for the area after the two communities had been brought together. After due consideration, Council decided to run an elector poll in conjunction with the 2005 Local Government elections, aiming to seek the views of its electors on the proposed name change from Waratah-Wynyard Council and municipal area to Table Cape Council and municipal area.

Electors were asked:

Do you support changing the name of the Waratah-Wynyard Council and municipal area to the Table Cape Council and municipal area?

Votes received were as follows:
