## **Local Government Elections in Tasmania**

Every two years elections are held in all 29 municipal areas for the positions of mayor and deputy mayor and half the councillor positions. Where required, by-elections are held concurrently for vacancies that have occurred since the last elections. In 2009, 27 elections were held in September/October, with the Break O'Day and Glamorgan-Spring Bay elections being postponed while an investigation into a proposed voluntary merger between them took place. These elections were then held in November/December.

The Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) supervises the conduct of elections in accordance with the *Local Government Act* 1993. Elections by postal ballot have been held in 1994, 1996, 1999 (deferred from 1998), 2000, 2002, 2005 (deferred from 2004), 2007 and 2009 with the next elections due in October 2011.

Since 2000, mayors and deputy mayors have been elected directly by the electors in all municipal areas. Previously, in most councils, mayors and deputy mayors were elected by the councillors at the first meeting of a new council.

## Casual vacancies

Casual vacancies are filled by recount where possible, unless the vacancy occurs within 6 months of a forthcoming election. Only unelected candidates from the relevant election may contest a recount. A candidate elected at a recount serves until the next council election. If a recount is not possible, a by-election is held—with the candidate elected to serve for the remainder of the term of office of the original councillor.

## Elector polls

A council may hold an elector poll on any issue it determines. It may also be required to hold an elector poll following petitions from electors in accordance with Part 6 of the Act. A council is not bound by the result of an elector poll.

#### Electoral system

Voting in Tasmanian local government elections is not compulsory.

Elections for councillor positions are conducted using a system modelled on the Hare-Clark method of proportional representation used in Tasmanian House of Assembly elections.

Mayoral and deputy mayoral elections use a preferential system similar to that used for Tasmanian Legislative Council and federal House of Representatives elections.

## **Report on the 2009 West Coast Council Election**

Elections were held for the positions of Mayor and Deputy Mayor for 2 year terms, and 6 Councillors, 5 of which for 4 year terms and 1 casual vacancy for a 2 year term.

3298 West Coast electors were enrolled for the 2009 elections, comprising 3238 (98.18%) from the State House of Assembly roll and 60 (1.82%) from the General Manager's roll.

65.65% of West Coast electors returned their ballot papers in comparison with 55.54% statewide.

## Recounts

A recount was conducted on 30 May 2008, to fill a vacancy for Councillor on the West Coast Council following the resignation of Miriam Hamill on 19 May 2008. Both unelected candidates from the 2007 West Coast Council election contested the recount.

A recount was conducted on 19 November 2008 to fill a vacancy for Councillor on the West Coast Council following the death of Mo El-Said on 4 November 2008. Three unelected candidates from the 2005 West Coast Council election contested the recount. Full details are provided on the back page.





#### **Elector Poll**

In mid 2008, the Tasmanian Electoral Commission conducted a poll of West Coast Council electors to gauge their opinion on the proposed move of Council administration from Zeehan to Queenstown.

The poll was conducted following lodgement of a petition signed by over 5% of the electors within the municipal area. Electors were asked whether they agreed to the proposed move.

Ballot material was delivered to West Coast electors from Tuesday 24 to Friday 27 June 2008. The poll closed at 10am on Tuesday 8 July 2008.
