

# Instructions

Follow these five easy steps:

## 1. Get to know the candidates

Candidates were invited to provide a statement and photo for your consideration\*.

Statements appear here in alphabetical order but the names on your ballot paper may not be in the same order.

## 2. Record your vote

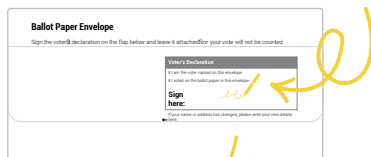
Number the boxes on each ballot paper from 1 onwards in the order of your choice.

## 3. Make your vote secret

Put your completed ballot paper in the ballot paper envelope and seal it securely.

## 4. Validate your vote


Sign your ballot paper envelope - **your vote won't be counted if you don't.**



Then put your ballot paper envelope in the reply paid envelope and seal it.



## 5. Post your vote

Post your reply paid envelope straight away (no stamp needed), or take your vote to the King Island Council office.
